Aligned with the 2026 theme, <i>“Space Garden: Growing Food in Space,”</i> the activity enhances critical thinking and creative presentation skills.</p> <p>It also serves as the national qualifier to select three Filipino representatives for the 32nd Asia-Pacific Regional Space Agency Forum (APRSAF) Poster Contest.</p>
<p>2. GeoGuhit: Move. Map. Make your mark.</p>	<p>Centered around the theme <i>“Navigating Tomorrow,”</i> this unique competition challenges participants to make connections between science, physical activity, and technology by creating route-based artwork using GPS tracking applications (via walking, running, or cycling). The contest is open to high school students (Junior and Senior high school), college/ tertiary-level students, and the general public, each with distinct thematic requirements that reflect their level of engagement with space science.</p>

	<p>The following are the designated subject/theme for each category:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • High School Students – GPS artwork depicting any recognized constellation or asterism, reflecting the use of celestial navigation and astronomy as foundational tools of space science • College/Tertiary Level Students – GPS artwork depicting Philippine space assets, including satellites (e.g., Diwata-1, Diwata-2, Maya-1, Maya-2, MULA, etc), ground infrastructure, or other space technologies developed, owned, or operated by the Philippines • General Public – GPS artwork on any subject of the participant's choosing, provided the artwork and its accompanying write-up demonstrate a clear and meaningful connection to the theme "Navigating Tomorrow" and the role of space science and technology in shaping the future
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In connection with this, we respectfully request your good office to disseminate this invitation to all public and private elementary and secondary schools within your region. By encouraging participation, we hope to inspire young minds to explore STEM fields and highlight the creative side of space science and technology applications.

Attached to this letter are the contest mechanics, formatting specifications, and guidelines for both contests.

PhilSA will officially notify the finalists and winners via email, and the announcement of winners will be made during the PSW celebration. Similarly, the names of the winners, along with their schools and winning entries, shall be featured and promoted on PhilSA's official website and social media pages.

<p>2. <i>#YamangKalawakan</i> Poetry Writing Contest (<i>Tula Para sa Mga Buntabay ng Pilipinas</i>)</p>	<p>The poetry competition is open to all Filipinos aged 9 to 25 and is divided into four categories: Elementary (Grades 4–6), Secondary (Grades 7–12), Tertiary (undergraduate and Tech-Voc students), and Open (graduate students, professionals, and other interested individuals).</p> <p>Entries must be original, unpublished works written in Filipino, and must not have been submitted to or awarded by any other competition.</p> <p>Each poem should reflect the theme "<i>Yamang Kalawakan, Para sa Mundo, Para sa Bayan</i>" focusing on honoring Philippine satellites—Mula, Diwata, and Maya—and the Filipinos behind these space resources.</p>

MECHANICS AND GUIDELINES

The *#YamangKalawakan Poster-Making Contest* aims to foster creativity and artistic expression while promoting awareness of space science and technology applications among elementary learners. It encourages participants to visually communicate complex scientific concepts—in this case, the theme “*Space Garden: Growing Food in Space*”—thereby enhancing their critical thinking, and presentation skills.

The activity also serves as the local contest to determine the country’s official entries to the 32nd Asia-Pacific Regional Space Agency Forum (APRSAF) Space Education for All Working Group (SE4AWG) Poster Contest in October 2026.

Challenge

Through a poster, showcase your interpretation of the theme “**Space Garden: Growing Food in Space**”.

Contest Mechanics and Guidelines

1. The contest is open to students aged 6 to 12 years by 31 December 2026 (Date of birth between 1 January 2014 to 31 December 2020) from any public or private school in the Philippines. It will be on an individual basis only.
2. Relatives of the Philippine Space Agency (PhilSA) employees up to the 2nd degree of consanguinity and affinity are ineligible from joining the contest.
3. The posters should align with the theme: “**Space Garden: Growing Food in Space**”.
4. Deadline of submissions:
 - Online submission (Jotform): 15 July 2026 (Wednesday)
 - Physical copy (Posters) : 20 July 2026 (Monday)



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5. The posters must comply with the following:

Digital artwork will not be accepted.
Prohibitions	<p>Artwork that violates any of the following rules will be disqualified from the Poster Awards voting process:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• NO text, letters, characters, or artist signatures anywhere on the front of the artwork.• NO national flags, country names, abbreviations, or space agency logos.• NO 3D objects, photo collages, or assembled items attached to the paper surface.• NO depiction or reference to a specific person, organization, country, brand, logo, or religious theme.

MECHANICS AND GUIDELINES

Proclamation No. 302 s. 2023 declared every 08 to 14 August as the Philippine Space Week (PSW) to promote space awareness, highlight the contribution of Filipinos worldwide in the field of space science, and espouse the value, benefits, and impacts of space science and technology applications (SSTA) on the lives of Filipinos. The celebration of this year's PSW held under the theme #YamangKalawakan, Para sa Mundo, Para sa Bayan, also marks the 6th Anniversary of the Agency. A series of stakeholder and public engagement activities will take place to commemorate this milestone. One of these activities is the conduct of a poetry contest dubbed "#Yamang Kalawakan Poetry Contest: Mga Tula para sa mga Buntabay ng Pilipinas" which aims to pay homage to the series of satellites designed, developed, and assembled by Filipino researchers and engineers.

This contest provides a platform for students of all genders across all levels of education to showcase their creativity and artistic expression while promoting space science and technology applications. It encourages participants to make connections between science, arts and literature.

Contest Mechanics and Guidelines

1. This competition is open to all Filipinos 9 – 25 years old and has the following categories:
 - a. Elementary – covers Grades 4 to Grade 6 learners
 - b. Secondary – covers Grade 7 to Grade 12 learners
 - c. Tertiary – covers undergraduate students and students in tech-voc programs
 - d. Open – covers graduate students, professionals and other interested individuals
2. Officials and employees of PhilSA and their relatives up to second degree of affinity or consanguinity are not eligible to join the contest.
3. The entry must comply with the following:
 - a. The poem must be an original composition and must have not been previously submitted to, selected in, or awarded by any other competition, nor published in any form—print, digital, or online platforms (including personal blogs, social media, or literary websites). Simultaneous submissions are not allowed
 - b. The piece must be written in Filipino.
 - c. The poem must be related to the theme "Yamang Kalawakan, Para sa Mundo, Para sa Bayan" with focus on paying homage to the satellites of the Philippines, namely Mula, Diwata and Maya, and the Filipinos who designed, developed and assembled them.

- d. Entries may be written in any form or style of poetry but should NOT exceed 1 page of an A4-sized bond paper.
 - e. AI-generated entries will not be accepted and are automatically disqualified
 - f. In the case of AI-assisted work, participants should declare the extent AI was used. The only acceptable use of AI is when looking for substitute or alternate words such as synonym, antonym, and rhyming terms to enhance word play.
4. Participants will have to download the submission form <https://bit.ly/YKRequiredForms> and prepare the supporting documents before submitting their entries through any of the following:

5. Only one entry per person is allowed. Entries must follow the following format for submission:
- i. A4 sized document, saved in PDF
 - ii. Font style: Arial, size: 12
 - iii. Single spaced
 - iv. 1-inch margin from the sides, top, and bottom
6. The deadline for submission is **July 6, 2025**. Only entries with complete documents will be evaluated.
7. All submitted works will remain the property of their respective owners but may be used by PhilSA for publications, websites, social media, educational materials, and other informational content exclusively for the promotion of space education.
8. The panel of judges shall use the following criteria to determine the winners:

Criteria	Description	Weight
Content and relevance to the theme	Explores the theme in meaningful ways and conveys a clear and engaging message.	30 %

Artistry and Originality	The poem demonstrates originality of thought and style in an artistic and creative way.	30 %
Use of language	Uses purposeful and effective words to articulate message with clarity, fluid, and clear thoughts	30 %
Impact	The poem evokes intellectual and emotional experience	10%
Total		100%

9. Three winning entries per category shall be awarded during the celebration of Philippine Space Week on August 09 and shall receive the following cash prize

<i>First Place</i>	<i>PhP 10,000.00</i>
<i>Second Place</i>	<i>PhP 5,000.00</i>
<i>Third Place</i>	<i>PhP 3,000.00</i>

10. First place winners in each category will present their piece orally during the awarding program.
11. The winning students and their coaches/guardians shall be flown in and billeted for two nights in Manila for the Awarding Ceremony on 9 August 2025 during the Philippine Space Week. The expenses for the air fare/transportation, lodging and accommodation shall be charged against the Education and Scholarships Program (ESP). Participants are required to present and submit the original receipts addressed to the Philippine Space Agency to claim the reimbursement.

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GeoGuhit: Move, Map & Make your mark.

MECHANICS AND GUIDELINES

GeoGuhit is a GPS art contest organized by the Philippine Space Agency (PhilSA) as part of Philippine Space Week 2026. Participants create artwork by tracing walking, running, or cycling routes that, when mapped using a GPS tracking application, form a recognizable image or design. This year's contest is anchored on the theme "Navigating Tomorrow" — a call for Filipinos to use the tools of space science not only to find their way, but to chart a future shaped by technology, curiosity, and purpose.

The Challenge

To design and complete a GPS-traced artwork that reflects a space science concept, Filipino innovation, or a personal vision of the future. The artwork is created entirely through physical activity — walking, running, or cycling — using a GPS tracking application to record the route. The contest is open to high school students, college and tertiary-level students, and the general public, each with distinct thematic requirements that reflect their level of engagement with space science.

Contest Mechanics and Guidelines

1. This competition is open to all Filipinos currently residing in the Philippines and has the following categories:
 1. High School Students – covers Junior and Senior High School students
 2. College/Tertiary Level Students – covers undergraduate students and students in technical-vocational programs
 3. General Public – covers all other interested individuals

2. The GPS artwork must be related to the theme "Navigating Tomorrow" and comply with the designated subject/theme requirements of the participant's category:
 1. High School Students – GPS artwork depicting any recognized constellation or asterism, reflecting the use of celestial navigation and astronomy as foundational tools of space science
 2. College/Tertiary Level Students – GPS artwork depicting Philippine space assets, including satellites (e.g., Diwata-1, Diwata-2, Maya-1, Maya-2, MULA, etc), ground infrastructure, or other space technologies developed, owned, or operated by the Philippines
 3. General Public – GPS artwork on any subject of the participant's choosing, provided the artwork and its accompanying write-up demonstrate a clear and meaningful connection to the theme "Navigating Tomorrow" and the role of space science and technology in shaping the future

3. Participants must use a GPS tracking application that meets the following minimum technical requirements:
 - records the participant's route in real time using the device's GPS signal (manually plotted or digitally drawn routes are not acceptable);
 - displays the complete route on a map upon completion of the activity;
 - shows the total recorded distance, activity date, and activity type (walking, running, or cycling); and



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- generates a screenshot or exportable image of the route map with the above details clearly visible.

Commonly used applications that meet these requirements include Strava, Garmin Connect, Google Fit, and MapMyRun, among others. PhilSA does NOT endorse any specific application. Participants are encouraged to verify that their chosen application meets the above requirements before beginning their activity.

4. Entries must satisfy the following minimum recorded activity distances:
 1. High School Students – minimum of 1.5 kilometers
 2. College/Tertiary Level Students – minimum of 3 kilometers
 3. General Public – minimum of 3 kilometers
4. Officials and employees of PhilSA, and their relatives up to the second degree of affinity or consanguinity, are not eligible to join the contest.
5. The entry must comply with the following requirements:
 - a. The GPS artwork must be personally created and completed by the participant using a GPS tracking application during the official competition period.
 - b. The GPS artwork must be created through walking, running, or cycling routes recorded using GPS tracking applications capable of route mapping.
 - c. The artwork must be related to the theme “Navigating Tomorrow” and must comply with the designated subject/theme requirements of the participant’s category.
 - d. Entries must be created within the official competition period.
 - e. Participants may use any publicly accessible and safe route or location in creating their GPS artwork, provided that all local traffic and safety regulations are observed.
 - f. Participants may use route planning tools, including .gpx plotting and AI-assisted planning tools, in conceptualizing their GPS artwork. However, all submitted entries must be personally completed and authentically recorded by the participant through actual walking, running, or cycling activities. Manipulated, simulated, falsified, or AI-generated activity records shall be grounds for disqualification. Any use of AI-assisted tools must be declared through the AI Declaration Form.
 - g. Entries containing offensive, inappropriate, discriminatory, or plagiarized content shall be automatically disqualified.
6. A participant can submit up to two (2) entries in one (1) category only. Each entry must be submitted separately and must include the following requirements:
 - a. Screenshot or exported image of the completed GPS artwork embedded in the route map, with visible activity summary/details from the GPS tracking application, submitted in JPEG or PNG format, with a maximum file size of 10 MB. Submitted screenshots/exported images must be clear, readable, and of sufficient quality to allow proper evaluation of the GPS artwork and required activity details.
 - b. The submitted image must clearly display the following details:



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- i. full route map/artwork;
 - ii. total recorded distance;
 - iii. activity date; and
 - iv. activity type, indicating whether the route was completed by walking, running, or cycling.
 - c. A fast-track video/screen recording of the recorded activity route or a public link to the recorded activity, which must remain accessible for the entire duration of the competition;
 - d. A short write-up or caption (maximum of 150 words) explaining the concept of the artwork and its relevance to the theme "Navigating Tomorrow."
7. Participants shall submit their entries through the official GeoGuhit Submission Form, accessible at <https://bit.ly/GeoGuhit2026>. Entries submitted through any other channel will not be accepted.
- Before proceeding to the Submission Form, participants must download, accomplish, and sign all required forms, which are available at <https://bit.ly/GeoGuhitForms>. In addition to the submission requirements enumerated above, each entry must include the following:
- Accomplished and signed Certificate of Undertaking.
 - Accomplished and signed AI Declaration Form (if applicable);
 - Accomplished and signed Certificate of Endorsement (if applicable); and
 - Copy of valid school ID or proof of enrollment or registration for the current or immediately preceding academic year, for High School Student and College/Tertiary Level Student participants.
8. Participants will receive an acknowledgment upon successful submission.
9. The deadline for submission is 22 July 2026 (Wednesday). Only entries with complete attachments will be evaluated.
10. All submitted works shall remain the property of their respective owners but may be used by PhilSA in publications, websites, social media, educational materials, and other informational content exclusively for the promotion of space education.
11. The panel of judges shall use the following criteria to determine the winners:
