- a. Posting of campaign and advocacy materials in support with the celebration, in conformity with the design set by NCDA, within the DepEd schools and premises;
- b. Facilitating symposia involving parents, learners, and community leaders to discuss this year's theme;
- c. Creating advocacy campaign materials such as posters, slogans, etc., detailing tangible steps they will take for inclusion of learners with autism; and
- d. Organizing a day camp for learners with autism to explore new skills and social play in a safe, structured, and joy-filled environment.



Call to Action:

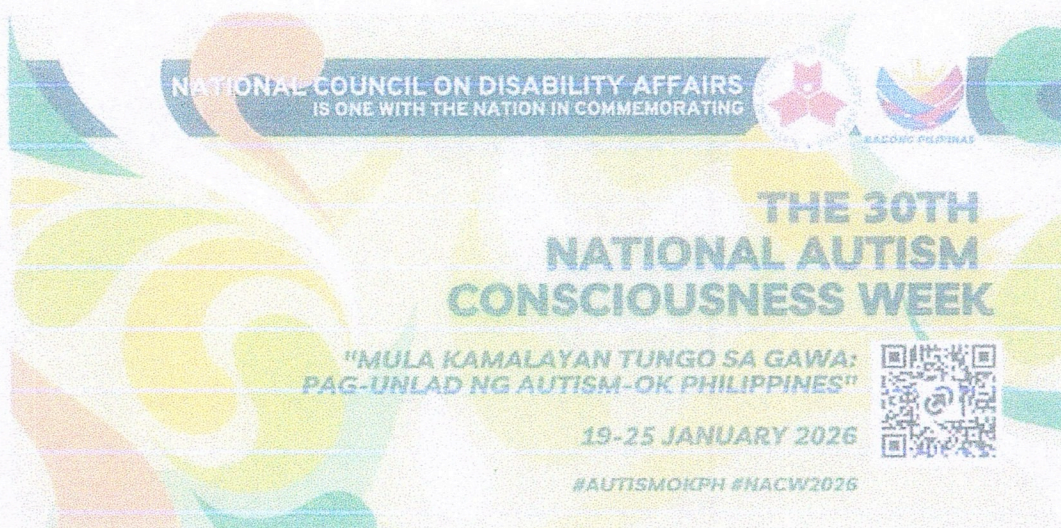




